
Celebrate Recovery program here at DCCF Church.

# RECIPIES

## **Yummy Scotcheroos**

They're fun to make. And, thanks to the chocolate. butterscotch and peanut butter. they're even more fun to eat.

- 1 cup light corn syrup
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup peanut butter
- 6 cups Kellogg's® Rice Krispies<sup>®</sup> cereal

We offer beautiful vacation rentals for the short term only. We want to allow others to enjoy the beauty that Tonto Basin provides at an affordable price.


## What is your favorite thing about living and owning a business in Tonto Basin?

#### **Tonto Creek Bridge Project A-Cross Road Permanent Closure**

Gila County is pleased to an announce its planned opening of the Tonto Creek Bridge in the spring of 2024. This multimodal transportation project includes the construction of the bridge over Tonto Creek with pedestrian and bicyclist facilities. Additional improvements include improving deficient roadway geometry.

The opening of the bridge is a milestone for the project. Residents will no longer be cut off from food, medical supplies, emergency services, work, and school. The bridge opening will enrich the quality of life for residents of Tonto basin. Enhanced recreational opportunities on public Forest Service lands will benefit everyone.

Beginning around January 1st 2024, the existing A-Cross road (FR 60) will be permanently closed and restored to its original condition. The contractor will scarify the abandoned access road and seed the area with native seedlings. A variety of seed mixes will be used from seed suppliers through harvesting of wildland collections or field-grown seeds.

Berms and boulders will be placed at each end of A-Cross as it crosses Tonto Creek. Erosion and sediment control measures will supplement the seeding. These erosion and pollution control principles will serve as a foundation for the successful restoration of A-Cross road to its natural conditions. Riparian habitat will be reestablished with the removal of this at-grade crossing.

The number one goal of this project has always been safety. The opening of the bridge and permanent closure of across road is a major step towards that goal.

- A safe route to school for students and teachers of Tonto Basin Elementary School.
- Emergency access for firefighters, police, and all first responders.

Please consider this permanent closure of A-Cross road in your travel plans beginning around January 1st 2024.

Tonto Basin offers a variety of outdoor recreational opportunities,

**Cottonwood Trail 120:** From the Frazier Trailhead, the trail meanders over low ridges and through drainages until it drops into Cottonwood Canyon. Then it goes up the canyon and junctions with FR 341 that serves as the trail. Turn left onto FR 341 and travel south for approximately 1.5 miles. The trail takes off from the road to the south and continues to follow Cottonwood Canyon. After approximately 3 miles, the trail reaches the southern terminus at FR 83.

**Denton Trail 69:** From FR 421, the trail climbs steadily up the east face of the mountain. Some sections are quite steep. The trail eventually tops out at 5,760 feet elevation and then descends to Big Pine Flat for the last <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mile.

**Park Trail 66:** From the Park Creek Trailhead, the trail crosses Park Creek and climbs gradually through lower Sonoran Desert and riparian vegetation for  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile. The trail then ascends steeply towards the crest of the divide, passing through chaparral, semi-desert grassland and juniper woodland. The final 1¼ mile follows fairly even contours until meeting the headwaters of Park Creek. It terminates at Edwards Park in a stand of large ponderosa pines.

Sycamore Trail 68: From FR 421, the trail climbs steadily through lower Sonoran Desert and riparian vegetation up the arroyo formed by Sycamore Creek. It turns northward and continues to climb along a tributary, passing through chaparral,

The trail tops out on the El Oso Divide and then descends to its end at Edwards Park in a stand of large Ponderosa Pines.

Thompson Trail 121: From State Highway 188, the trail quickly climbs along an arroyo and then follows the contour of the ridges above the highway and Roosevelt Lake. After  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile, at the junction with the Cemetery Trail 255, the trail turns south and gradually ascends a broad ridge to the junction with FR 341. This trail is named after Jerome Thompson who served as district ranger, 1956-1965, for the then-named Roosevelt Ranger District.

Three Bar Route: The Three Bar Wildlife Enclosure is a fenced wildlife study area operated by Arizona Game and Fish. The proximity of two recreation sites provides ample parking should you want to cool off in Roosevelt Lake after your ride. Scenery includes the riparian habitat associated with Roosevelt Lake and watershed as well as chaparral vegetation.

Vineyard Trail 131: Trail passes through a variety of Lower Sonoran Desert vegetation plant communities. Spectacular views of Roosevelt Lake, Apache Lake, Roosevelt Dam and Four Peaks. Historic Camp O'Rourke located near the east

abandoned tent sites and building foundations are visible from the trail. As part of the Arizona Trail, the route continues west on the Four Peaks Trail 130 or southwest across Roosevelt Bridge to the Thompson Trail 121. Source: https://www. fs.usda.gov/
